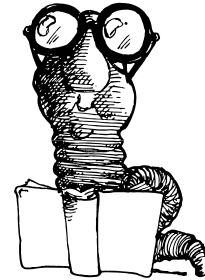


# 2008 Qualification Examiner Workshop
